On Saturday 16th April an Open Meeting was held at Calder High School to discuss flooding issues in the area. This meeting was well attended by local residents and business owners as well as our MP and local councillors, in addition to representatives from the Environment Agency and a consortium of companies who specialise in flood defence work and who were recently engaged in strengthening the flood defences in Todmorden.

There were plenty of heated exchanges, especially between the residents and the Environment Agency and feelings were expressed that they had not been pro-active enough in dredging the rivers. Also it was thought that Yorkshire Water could have done more to reduce the level of the reservoirs prior to the forecast heavy rain. Yorkshire Water did not send a representative to the meeting.

There was also a call for the residents to be kept better informed on how the £35million allocated for work to be done will be spent.

To this end, we were told that an office would be opened above the dentists surgery in Mytholmroyd and this would be a place where local people can voice their views and keep up to date with progress.

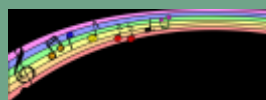
