## VISIT CASTLE CARR GROUNDS AND WATER GARDENS on SUNDAY JUNE 24th

Permission has again been granted by the Scholefield family who own the estate, for us to enjoy this traditional day out and see the world famous gravity fed fountain.

A walk of approximately 3 miles will leave Midgley Bus Terminus at 11am led by Rema Sim. The walk does involve some uphill sections and climbing stiles, so please have appropriate clothing and footwear. It is a family event so the pace will be to suit everyone. Dogs MUST be kept on leads. The fountain will be switched on about 1.30pm. Please bring your own picnic. Drinks will be available to buy.

Entry is by ticket at the gates. £4 per adult and £1 per child. The bottom gate will be open from 12noon. Entry at the top gate is STRICTLY for people with limited walking ability as there is not a lot of parking space near to the Castle. Please bear in mind that once there, some may find it a difficult walk down to see the fountain. The surrounding lanes are very narrow, so please DO NOT PARK on Catherine House Lane, Saltonstall Lane or at Lower Edge.

It was described as having created 'an energetic musical legacy'. It demonstrated how something positive can come out of challenging times. The director of Calderland stated that 'it was truly a love letter to the Calder Valley and this award is a brilliant tribute to everyone who worked to make it such a great success.'
